The Benton County Historical Society and Museum is now located at 202 2nd Ave S (across from Coborn's).

This 146-year-old home is on the National Registry of Historic Places as the Leonard Robinson House and is the oldest documented house in Sauk Rapids. This landmark building itself contains the original local granite block used when it was built in 1873 by quarry owner Leonard Robinson. After Robinson, the home was owned by Judson A. Stanton, a Benton County surveyor who also managed railroad work in the county. The house is now open as a historical society, a museum, for research, and for public use. Did you know?

The Robinson-Stanton home in downtown Sauk Rapids is one of the few structures that was left standing after the 1886 tornado destroyed most of the town.
